**Catalog description:** Participate in a group project to explore the technical, social and ethical aspects of software development. Topics include: requirements engineering, enterprise-level data storage, software architecture, security, software testing, legal issues, computer ethics, risk management and project management.

**Course goals:** Your group will develop an idea, develop a business plan, form an LLC, develop a software-based product and deliver a pitch for further funding at the end of the semester using Kanban for Agile Project Management. Your group will also select an open-source project to contribute to with an expectation of at least one change accepted per group member. As an individual, you will explore additional software development topics via lectures/discussions, book presentations and a take-home exam requiring research on several topics.
